SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Coordsen. We will now vote on the amendment offered by Senator Coordsen. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 7 ayes, 13 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: The amendment fails. Anything further on the bill?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Hall would move to amend. (See AM1497 as found on page 1902 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members. The amendment that is found on 1902 of the Journal is an amendment that was offered by the Department of Revenue. What it is, is a nothing more than a technical change. It's a redraft of LB 727 so that the bill does exclusively what its intent was. There was an issue presented on the...by Senator Hillman in the introduction of the bill dealing with the language of an occasional sale and what qualifies as an occasional sale. The draft that we sent out of committee we thought was technically correct. After the department looked at it for a while they thought that the potential was there for it to be broader in its scope than was intended. They asked that I offer this amendment to just clarify and narrow down the provisions. It's really nothing more than a...we would feel more comfortable with this kind of language than the language that you sent out of committee. It is a technical redraft of the bill as it was introduced. I would urge adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: Any discussion of the amendment by Senator Hall? Seeing none, Senator Hall, do you wish to close? He waives closing. We will now proceed to vote on the amendment offered by Senator Hall. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Hall's amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: The amendment by Senator Hall is adopted. Anything further on the bill?
