

rate set for other types of judgments is computed on a biweekly basis and is set at 1 percent above the 52-week, the most recent 52-week T bill auction rate. This was originally LB 136. It did have a hearing in the Judiciary Committee, but it was held, the hearing was held late and we simply didn't get the bill reported out. At any rate, this is largely, as I say, a conforming and technical amendment, would just conform the interest rate on delinquent child support to the interest rate on other kinds of judgments and I would urge its adoption.

SENATOR MORRISSEY PRESIDING
