

totally was unprepared on this, and I did talk to you about the fact that they were going to discontinue the \$1.00 fee because it was more expense really for them to bother with doing the paperwork and collect the fee than it was to actually collect it, so we eliminated that in the bill itself. Now what we're doing is having to add \$3,000 because that's what they expect to have lost because of removing the requirement. So that's why we have the A bill for the \$3,000. I'm sorry.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Thank you, Senator Smith. Senator Schellpeper, on Senator Smith's amendment.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Thank you, Mr. Chairman and members. I rise to support the amendment. This will make the total A bill then \$24,000, some dollars this year, in '91-92, and \$28,000 plus in '92-93. Thank you.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Thank you, Senator Schellpeper. Would anyone else like to speak on the Smith amendment? Seeing no one, Senator Smith, would you care to close?

SENATOR SMITH: No.
