PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Lynch. We will vote on the Lynch amendment to the committee amendments. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted on the Lynch amendment? Have you all voted? Senator Lynch.

SENATOR LYNCH: Madam Chairman, the other day I said there comes a time, I'm not quite sure whose going to do what, and who will vote for this amendment, but since there are a number of people who haven't voted, I really hate to do this, guess I'm forced to ask for a call of the house and a roll call vote, in regular order.

PRESIDENT MOUL: We have a request for a call of the house and a roll call vote in regular order. Now vote on the motion for call of the house. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The house is under call. Would all unexcused senators please return to the Chambers and record their presence. All unauthorized personnel must leave the floor. Would the senators please check in. We're looking for Senator Ashford, Senator Bernard-Stevens, Senator Rasmussen, Senator Conway, Senator Cudaback, Senator Schrock, Senator Labedz. Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: Point of order, Madam Chair. How many votes does this take?

PRESIDENT MOUL: It's a simple majority.

SENATOR LAMB: Simple majority. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Labedz, would you please check in. We'll proceed with the roll call vote in regular order on the Lynch amendment...amendment to the committee amendments.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 1959 of the Legislative Journal.) 19 ayes, 21 nays, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The amendment to the amendment fails. Do you have further amendments on the desk?
