

backgrounds of contractors to make sure that they are above board, that their systems have been used elsewhere, that they have the requisite integrity to be awarded a contract with the State of Nebraska. With respect to Lotto America, the way that a situation like that works is, if Lotto America approves an application for a state to join them, they will come in and they will tell you what the ground rules are, here are the hoops you have to jump through in order to meet our requirements. Now you have the right to use our logo and once you've met those requirements, you're on your own. You go out and you operate your lottery and you're are tied into the central Lotto America computer and Lotto America operates side by side of a state lottery. It essentially is just an extension of a state lottery only the pool for the grand prize is all the states put together and a state is rewarded according the proportion of a play that occurs within that state, that just to amplify a little on the discussion that Senator Smith and Senator Schellpeper had. That's how that works. Thank you.
