LB 256, 256A, 577

PRESIDENT MOUL: LB 256 is advanced. I would like to direct the senators attention to the south balcony, special guests today of Senator Schellpeper are 22 fourth graders from Stanton Elementary School in Stanton, with their teachers. Thank you. We will proceed with LB 256A.

CLERK: LB 256A, Madam President, was introduced by Senator Schimek. (Read title.) It was introduced on April 22.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, Madam President and members of the body, as I mentioned to you in the discussion of the bill, the fiscal note for the first year on this is \$40,865. For the second year, it is \$42,623. It goes up slightly. It looks as if that is for salary and increased benefits for the main part. There are \$3,000 in it, I was mistaken, there are \$3,000 in it each year for committee travel and reimbursement, and then there is about 2,000 miscellaneous. So that is what the bill is now, radically cut from its approximately million and a half a year in the earlier version. Unless there are any questions, I would just move advancement.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Schimek. Is there anyone who wishes to speak to this bill? Seeing none, we will vote on the advancement of LB 256A. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the advancement of 256A.

PRESIDENT MOUL: LB 256A is advanced. Proceed with LB 577.

CLERK: LB 577 was a bill introduced by Senator Baack. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 23, referred to Judiciary for public hearing, advanced to General File. I do have Judiciary Committee amendments pending. (See AM0449 on page 1139 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Chizek.
