PRESIDENT MOUL: The amendment is adopted. Do you have anything further on the desk?

CLERK: Madam President, Senator Chambers would move to amend the committee amendments.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam Chair and members of the Legislature, I am offering an amendment to Senator Baack's amendment that was just adopted, so in order that the wording is...Mr. Clerk, is the wording that I am inserting, then I will give what the amendment does, "a judgment is"?

CLERK: Would you ask me the question again, Senator?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, would you read the amendment as offered then?

CLERK: Well, may I ask you a question before?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

CLERK: So you are attempting to amend the amendment we just adopted, is that right, Senator?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Right, Senator Baack's amendment to the committee amendment.

CLERK: May I draft, because the way you drafted to amend the committee amendment, I think we should reference Speaker Baack's amendment, AM1279.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Perfect, good. That is why we hire the Clerk and give him a salary which I think is too low, and we need to put some merit pay money into our budget by the time it comes out here.

CLERK: Senator, your amendment would then, if I understand it, on page 1 of the Baack amendment strike lines 15 and 16.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No, no. I just sent an amendment up there.
