

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Then if there is no opposition from Senator Baack, I will see whether there is opposition from anybody else before I offer additional comments.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Are there any questions or any debate on this amendment? Seeing none, do you have closing, Senator Chambers?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: The only thing I will say, so that the record is clear as to what my amendment will do, it is to reduce the number of judgments from two to one, and make sure that any language that exists in Senator Baack's amendment, which refers to multiple judgments, will be changed to conform to the fact that we are dealing with one judgment, and I have a note from the Godfather or Hit Man #1, from outside, that this is all right, to be sure that the amendment is drafted correctly and we will take it. And if there is anything in this which is not clearly stated in the amendment as I have stated it on the floor, you all will call me "Shorty" because I am to be reduced in height from my knees down. I am going to tell you all something. It is very pleasant to be in the position where I have that powerful tobacco lobby supporting something that I am doing. It does create a kind of euphoria, and I don't know if chewing tobacco does that or smoking does it, but to risk your life for a product, it ought to give you something other than the cancer that is going to take you away from here. But I can see why people carry bills for these big shots now. I meant, all of a sudden I look around at my colleagues, and you all don't look so important any more. Senator Robinson, during an oral roll call vote, will speak very loudly, and sometimes he startles me because I am not paying attention. Well, he can shout at the top of his lungs now and Senator Robinson doesn't mean a thing, I have got the tobacco lobby with me. Senator Hillman is sitting there smiling and, as I say, looking attractive as usual. I have got the lobby with me. This has never happened before, but, Senator Hall, this is still an atrocious bill. This is an atrocious bill because they should not be allowed to violate the law and ever get a license to do this again. But since I used the analogy of an apple, I have to take a bite one time...take it one bite at a time. So what I would like to see, because these manufacturers know what they are doing, and to make it clear they know what they are doing, I would like to ask Senator Baack another question. Senator Baack, to whom are these manufacturers allowed to distribute their products?
