

SENATOR BAACK: The manufacturers?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR BAACK: The samples?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR BAACK: In our statutes, the way that it is amended now, they would only be able to give those to adults.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So then it is not limited to companies and distributors and so forth? The manufacturer can directly give the samples to any adults?

SENATOR BAACK: The way that we have done the bill is that the only person that can...the amendment is that the only person that can hand out samples is an employee or agent of the company, themselves.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So then we are not talking about a situation where through inadvertence, the company, the manufacturer does something wrong, it is an employee or an agent of the company that would do that?

SENATOR BAACK: That is correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I think if...thank you, Senator Baack...these companies can make their employees know what the situation is, and if they violate the law, that license to do this should be lifted and they should never be allowed to do it again in this state. So that is the next amendment that I am going to try to draft, but I may not be able to do it in time, so we may have to go to other things first.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Chambers. We will now vote on the Chambers amendment to the committee amendments. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.
