That would be found, the definition of it, on pages 2 and 3 of the green copy, starting in line 25, on page 2, and continuing through line 5 on page 3 are these words, "Private industrial production site shall mean the production location of a company or business engaged in the manufacture, construction, or wholesale distribution of goods or products, or the processing of raw materials, or agricultural products and the area adjacent to the production location". I would like to ask Senator Cudaback a question, because I see him and he is...he is acquainted with farm activity.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Cudaback.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Cudaback, are minors ever employed with reference to agricultural products at wholesale distribution locations, where agricultural products are being distributed at the wholesale level?

SENATOR CUDABACK: I guess I truthfully can't answer that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. Then I'll ask Senator Baack, he's standing here, I thought he might be looking at our other language. Okay. Is there...is there a farmer in the house who'd be willing to....Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President, Senator Chambers, the answer to your question, no.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: All right, they cannot be involved in the distribution, in the wholesale distribution of agricultural products.

SENATOR HABERMAN: That's correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: All right. What is a wholesale distribution of agricultural products? Where does the wholesale distribution occur, at what point?

SENATOR HABERMAN: Well, in Nebraska you could say when they gave aw...when they give away commodities, that's wholesale distribution. When they give away cheese, and flour, and sugar, and all that sort of stuff.
