Please check in, Senator Bernard-Stevens, Senator Chambers, Senator Kristensen, Senator Beyer. We are looking for Senator Chambers. We will have a roll call vote, and reverse order has been requested. I would request that the senators all stay in their seats also. Please proceed, Mr. Clerk, on the motion to indefinitely postpone. Speaker Baack.

SPEAKER BAACK: Point of...just a point of order, am I to understand it just takes a majority of those voting, correct?

PRESIDENT MOUL: Simple majority.

SPEAKER BAACK: Okay, thank you.
