We're looking for Senators Abboud, Senator Ashford, Senator Beyer, Senator Peterson. Senator Dierks.

SENATOR DIERKS: Could we have a reverse roll call vote, please?

PRESIDENT MOUL: Looking for Senator Coordsen, Senator Schrock. Senator Lamb, would you please check in. Still looking for Senator Peterson. We're still looking for Senator Peterson. Senator Warner, would you check in, please. We will proceed with a roll call vote in reverse order.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Roll call vote taken in reverse order. See page 1997 of the Legislative Journal.) The vote is 16 ayes, 24 nays, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The motion fails and I will raise the call. Mr. Clerk, do you have another amendment on the desk?
