SENATOR NELSON: Correct. I might want to share with the body I had the pleasure of attending the NSCL conference last week in Washington, D.C., and spent all of my time on education. There are some proposed changes coming in focusing on Pell grants, SSIG loans, and some of the loans that we now have available. I don't want to stand here and tell you that there are going to be definite changes. The proposed suggestion and senator...President Bush, or the education, is to increase the Pell grants from 2,400 to 3,700 dollars, the matching amount on the SSIG loans will be also addressed, more involvement of states on loans to ensure quality, direct loans no longer will include private banks. And so there will be considerable changes made in the loans. Disadvantaged students will be addressed, and the two main goals is, of course, the target to low income students. So I don't know exactly how this will fall into the proposal. But I think that you do need to know that, that there are some different changes coming in on students loans on the federal level.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Nelson. Any other discussion on the amendment to the committee amendments by Senator Moore. Seeing none, Senator Moore, do you wish to close?

SENATOR MOORE: I understand Senator Warner's concern or questions, and this is an amendment to tighten up the definition as to what the intent was as to who would qualify for these type of loans. This is a technical amendment. Does it, in and of itself, discriminate against students attending proprietary schools? I guess you'd argue that it does. That was always the intent of the bill, so it further defines that. So I would simply ask for adoption of the amendment, and then certainly we can discuss the bill when we discuss the committee amendments or the bill itself. So I ask for the adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: You've heard Senator Moore's closing on the amendment to the committee amendments. We will now vote on that amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.
