

funds that our Washington delegation has already secured is about 6 million dollars. That is 6 million dollars that is a nonfederal match that someone has to come up with to leverage those federal funds, that is 6 million dollars. Also, there is a variety of infrastructure type situations, boilers, chillers, generators that various representative university have felt are of concern. The six and a half millions dollars actually does, it's six and a half million dollars towards three specific projects, the Vine Street utility extension, the greenhouse in conjunction with the Beadle Center, and a new chiller on city campus, a chiller for air conditioning, which actually also serves the Capitol Building. The total of those three projects is projected to be 9.5 million dollars. And so basically what the committee has said with this is that we are committing six and a half million dollars to those three projects, we are still working exactly...does that mean the university will spend 9.5 million dollars, that's yet to be determined, but those three projects it is our intent are to be completed. So that was in Section 8 of the bill. Section 9 is the health science and education building, it's some planning money at the med center. Section 10 is to a...not to actually to renovate Copeland Hall, I think that's actually misspo...it's actually an addition to Copeland Hall. The money we have in this bill, that is not correct on there. The money we have in this bill is actually an addition to Copeland Hall, because that is part of the project that actually gives some very needed square footage out on the Kearney campus. The renovation of Copeland Hall is another part of the request that we have not chosen to fund, but it is felt that before we can move forward with the renovation, we need to have the addition built on so you move things around. So actually Section 10 is the addition to Copeland Hall. Then Section 11 is money for the renovation of the Arts and Science Hall at the University of Nebraska at Omaha. Those are the recommendations of the committee. This is to be paid for, as I said, a mixture of cigarette tax and some additional General Funds in the next biennium that we would just like the reaffirmations we approved in our earlier bill, we would come up for reaffirmation, actually, in years to come. But that is our total proposal. With that I would move for adoption of the amendments.
