Those were two things that the university will contend would be nice but not necessary. And will we see those things coming back in the next few years, well I don't have a crystal ball. As far as other things than the Beadle Center, as far as additional capital construction, you'll understand that we are 3 million dollars short of the commitment that we're asking, of the three different projects. And to date at least it's my understanding the university feels they can, either through cutting back on the project, private funds, or reallocation make that work. And as far as operation, the operation of the Beadle Center...

SPEAKER BAACK: One minute.

SENATOR MOORE: ...money from the research initiative would be available towards the operation of the Beadle Center when it's up and running.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Is the other matter with the Beadle Center then things like the boiler, the other ones, those become, because it's a burden on the campus as a whole that those might become additional things that need to be done because of the burden that the Beadle Center may place upon the campus?

SENATOR MOORE: Those items, all three, boiler, chiller and generator, were all in the university's request this year.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Okay.

SENATOR MOORE: And those were all things that are arguably needed, regardless of the Beadle Center. If you add on the Beadle Center to the infrastructure at the university, it becomes more important. But the chiller is the one thing that, at least the committee is of the opinion, you simply have to build if you're going to construct the Beadle Center on the city campus.
