

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, Mr. President, members. I was just going to answer briefly Senator Hall's questions, and I have talked to him privately. But there are reasons for having research stations stationed around the state, because of various...different localities, different methods of doing things in different localities, and that's one of the reasons Concord and North Platte both were here for swine research. Both have been around a long time, Concord not nearly as long as North Platte. But there are different methods of utilizing research in those areas. And I think that's the reasons that both of these were funded. One is going to emphasize primarily the finish, and the other is farrowing, growing, and swine management at North Platte. I won't go into any more detail, but there are research institutions located around the state and around the country for those kind of reasons, to be closer to the producers. It provides more useful research information in most cases. Another thing I was going to say on Beadle, I don't know whether Senator Kristensen had any more questions on Beadle, maybe he doesn't. I guess I won't proceed with that at this time, since...But I would answer more questions on Beadle, if you have them, in time, Senator Kristensen.

SPEAKER BAACK: Next speaker is Senator Bernard-Stevens. Senator Bernard-Stevens waives off. Is there anyone else wishing to discuss the committee amendments? Seeing no one, Senator Moore, for closing on the committee amendments. Senator Lowell Johnson.

SENATOR L. JOHNSON: I'll move the committee amendments.

SPEAKER BAACK: We will now vote on the adoption of the committee amendments to LB 760. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. We are voting on the committee amendments to LB 760. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of committee amendments.

SPEAKER BAACK: The committee amendments are adopted. We are now on the bill. Senator Moore.

SENATOR MOORE: I would resist the temptation to continue on Senator Kristensen's line of questioning, and simply move for the advancement of the bill.
