SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Wesely. Senator Moore.

SENATOR MOORE: I just also rise to support Senator Wickersham's amendment. As they both mentioned, the second part of the amendment is a further clarification of language that was actually in the bill that I introduced before Senator Wesely's committee and Senator Wesely was gracious enough to include that in his package. I think the Senator Wickersham language makes it more clear. I simply support it. As well as the initial part of Senator Wickersham's amendment, I also think is clarification that makes a few more people in the state more comfortable with the bill. And so, with that, I would support Senator Wickersham's amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Moore. Any other further discussion on the Wickersham amendment to LB 836? Seeing none, Senator Wickersham, do you wish to close? Waives closing. We will now proceed to vote on the amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.
