

Funds...

SENATOR WESELY: Thirty...oh.

SENATOR WARNER: It's a small amount. You said 386?

SENATOR WESELY: Oh, no, this...it would go to Cash Fund, it wouldn't...right, there's no General Fund. Okay, so evidently the General Fund money stays, but we have 45,000 in Cash Funds for the amendment.

SENATOR WARNER: And the 32,000...

SENATOR WESELY: I guess that stays.

SENATOR WARNER: Yeah, okay, it's not...I just wondered if that's...

SENATOR WESELY: No, no, you're right.

SENATOR WARNER: I didn't know if it was adjusted.

SENATOR WESELY: No, you're right. We will have to make an adjustment to the A bill, but it won't be in the General Fund.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Warner. Any further discussion? Seeing none, Senator Wesely, do you wish to close?

SENATOR WESELY: No, again, this would make some changes in the statutes as to how we regulate home health aides. They would be merged into a single category from home health aide I and II, and change some of the requirements to again comply with the federal standards that had been adopted. So I'd move for the adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Wesely. We will now vote on the amendment as offered by Senator Wesely. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Wesely's amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: The amendment is adopted. Next item, Mr. Clerk.
