Ashford, Senator Beutler, please check in. Senator Hillman, Senator Schrock. Senator Kristensen. Senator Wesely, please return to the Chamber. We are still looking for Senators Abboud, Elmer, and Withem. Still looking for Senator Withem. Senator Will. Senator Withem is on his way up. Do you wish to proceed yet? Okay. If the senators would please be seated, we will proceed with the roll call vote on the motion to advance LB 849A. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Record vote taken. See pages 2085-86 of the Legislative Journal.) 19 ayes, 21 nays, Madam President, on the advancement.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Motion to advance fails. While the Legislature is in...I will raise the call. While the Legislature is in session and capable of conducting business, I propose to sign and do sign LB 203, LB 203A, LB 227, and LB 337. We will now proceed to LB 181, Select File.

CLERK: Mr. President, 180...Madam President, excuse me, 181, the bill was briefly discussed on April 23. At that time, Senator Lindsay made a motion to indefinitely postpone the bill. That motion is now pending.

PRESIDENT MOUL: I will recognize Senator Chizek.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Okay, Mr. Clerk, do you have other amendments?
