

good purpose served to continue to allow underworked judges to be underworked. They're paid pretty well, they should give a full days work, and in many areas they're not, they're not, they're simply not by any measure. And here is one mechanism by which you can say we're going to change this, and we're going to start right now. And if next year you want to get serious about redistricting, we'll look at what we've done this year, we'll look at the whole scene, and we'll consider what you have to say. But we're starting now, we're starting right now. If you want to catch up with us, you can. If you want to give us leadership, you can. If you want to suggest to us how it can be made better, we'll listen. But we're not waiting anymore, we're taking the leadership on this. I would ask the adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Beutler. I will now recognize senators in the following order, Senator Moore, Senator Warner, Senator Wesely, Senator Chambers, Senator Robak, Senator Schmit, and Senator Crosby. Senator Moore.

SENATOR MOORE: Madam President and members, I certainly don't disagree with anything in that dissertation that Senator Beutler just gave us. I mean what he's saying, I can't disagree with many of those things. Does that mean I agree with his amendment? Absolutely not. When you look at, besides the fact that Senator Beutler just includes other...affects some other districts around the Columbus district to make his point, you know...I mean I find it interesting what Senator Beutler is trying to do. He's basically trying to redraw these districts now on Select File. And what he's saying, it should have been done over the years, I can't disagree with that, Senator Beutler. But I...and I know you're going to accuse me of what you just accused Senator Wickersham and others about, about saying now wait a second, you just can't piecemeal this, it has to be a big picture. I understand your frustration, Senator Beutler. And you just listed out all the problems you've had over the years, but nevertheless I have to sit here and look at this and say, now wait a second, isn't it better off that we actually do some of these things. Look at some work load and make some big changes. I'm certainly not beyond going the ox in my own district to save money. I'm certainly willing to do that. But I guess in Senator Beutler's plan you're doing that to just a couple people at the expense of others, and I guess I have a little problem with that. And if a year from now, I mean I hate to postpone it for a year, I agree with you, Senator
