SENATOR CHIZEK: Correct.

PRESIDENT MOUL: There are no other lights, if you would like to close.

SENATOR CHIZEK: Well, basically Senator Moore helped me out and identified what is in 181 now and once again, I'll reiterate. The Judicial Resources Commission goes by the wayside, we go back to the status quo of the judge in Columbus, the judges in the 4th District with the sunset in January of 1993, and as you all know it will force judges and us, quite frankly, and the Bar to deal with this problem this coming year. So with that I would ask for your support and advancement of LB 181.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Chizek. Senator Will. I have a request for a machine vote. All those in favor on the motion to advance LB 181 please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: 28 ayes, 2 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of LB 181.

PRESIDENT MOUL: LB 181 is advanced. LB 181A.

CLERK: I have no amendments to 181A, Madam President.
