

PRESIDENT MOUL: One minute.

SENATOR LABEDZ: ...the former Miss America said her pain has been incomprehensible, but she felt she must tell her story to help her recovery and to help other victims. During the days no embarrassing or angry glances ever passed between my father and me because I had no conscious knowledge of the traumas and the terrors of being a "nightchild" and so I say that if we teach our children to communicate with their parents, either one or both parents, something like this might not have happened to her for 13 years. I reject the amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Labeledz. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President and members of the Legislature, I want to thank Senator Labeledz for helping to make the point. That young...when that grown woman was a young girl between the ages of 5 and 18 she was sexually molested by her father and had she been made pregnant prior to 18 she would have had to go back there to try to get permission to get an abortion. If she were 14 she would have had to go back to that devil to get permission and Senator Labeledz thinks that's all right, insists on it. When she compares pregnancy to drug use, it fits right in with what Senator Rasmussen had said. We equate pregnancy in young women with crimes. Drug abuse, drug use, drug dealing is a crime. She said if these youngsters were engaging in that and went to their family and told it, first of all they are not going to go to an abusive parent and tell that parent they're dealing drugs or using drugs. The law doesn't require that if they're involved in criminal activity. The law that Senator Labeledz and her loving colleagues want will require this young woman and everybody says it's a relatively small number, so I guess a small number don't count, force that young woman and others similarly situated into the abusive situation. Now I know Senator Labeledz is a church lady and she is familiar with various parables and everybody who has ever gone to church has heard the parable of the Good Shepherd. That's where there were 90 sheep plus nine who had no need of rescue but the Good Shepherd risked his life for the little lamb which was at risk. So if we equate these young women to lambs and there is only One, based on the standards set by the one you all worship, not me, the One you all pray to in here every morning, not me, that one is worthy of rescue and that One that you all worship had said about all this joy in heaven, when that One comes to
