Would the senators please take their seats and please check in. We are accepting call in votes on the motion to cease debate.

CLERK: Senator Coordsen voting aye. Senator Wehrbein voting aye. Senator Rogers voting aye. Senator Kristensen voting aye. Senator Wickersham voting aye. Senator Rod Johnson voting aye. Senator Lowell Johnson voting aye.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 1 nay to cease debate, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Debate does cease and we will go to Senator Landis for closing. Remind the senators the house is under call. Senator Landis.
