The interest in the welfare of the pregnant minor, the interests of the parents, and the interests of the family unit are relevant to our consideration of the constitutionality of the 48-hour waiting period, et cetera. The...later on in the opinion we refer to a status notion that governmental powers should supersede parental authority, in all cases, because some parents abuse and neglect children is repugnant to the American tradition. This is going through on their description of parental involvement as one of the bases for deciding the constitutionality of that statute. They also stated, page 27, we have held that when a parent or another person has assumed primary responsibility for a minor's well-being, the state may properly enact laws designed to aid and discharge their responsibility.
