PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Conway. Senator Robinson.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Senator Conway, I have a question, please.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Conway.

SENATOR ROBINSON: When you were talking about extending sympathy, were you just referring to those in the State of Nebraska?

SENATOR CONWAY: Correct. This is a recognition for those Nebraskans.

SENATOR ROBINSON: According to the VFW Magazine, there were not any women or men killed in action from the State of Nebraska. I don't know if you were aware of that. But as it was listed in the VFW Magazine, there were no...there were no casualties. There may have been some wounded but not killed in action.

SENATOR CONWAY: I have a lot of respect for the VFW Magazine, but they but they are not the official record of those who...I can check into that but I...

SENATOR ROBINSON: Well, I didn't know whether you knew that or not and I wanted to bring it to your attention.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Does anybody else wish to speak to this legislative resolution? Seeing none, we will vote on the motion to adopt LR 82. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 23 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on adoption of LR 82.

PRESIDENT MOUL: LR 82 is adopted. We will now proceed with
