

if we do nothing, if we do nothing, everything comes back on. What I say is we have to do something to make everything come back on, as that's the way it should be, and that's all I can say about it. That explains it.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Can I have my time...how much time do I have?

SPEAKER BAACK: You've about two and a half minutes yet, Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Two and a half, oh, that's more than I need. I support Senator Lamb's amendment, the reason is, if I understand this correctly, go back to January 1 of '92, we have hearings, let's say there's a proposal comes in, it could be into March or later before we could have a solution to this. And here the assessors are sitting out there, obligated by present state law, of putting everything on, if I understand it correctly, and I...and even with the distinct or remote, whichever, possibility that all personal property could go back on. So I support Senator Lamb's amendment. I don't think that we need a so-called hammer, or even a sledge hammer to bring people together to talk about this. I'm also going to assume, and will publicly state I think that everyone is going to have to work in good faith and look for the solution to this. And we're going to have some areas that are going to be unhappy. We're going to have some areas that are going to be happy with what, probably mostly all will be unhappy, with what we're going to do. And I guess perhaps we're putting a lot of stock in the 3-R Committee and what they have to accomplish in the next few months, because if it hasn't been done in the last 20, I don't think that they can do it in the next 20 weeks. Hasn't been done in the last 20 years. But I support Senator Lamb's amendment, and I would, with the implication that there is going to have to be good faith offers of support,...

SPEAKER BAACK: One minute.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...broadly, for the money that's going to replace this personal property tax, wherever it may come from. And I, therefore, support Senator Lamb's amendment.
