

don't think that should happen. I don't think it should be a state, completely a state program. That's my problem with it. I'm trying to forge a bill here which is a partnership between state and local interests. The Conway amendment with or without Senator Morrissey's amendment takes that away. It makes the counties, the only authority they have is enforcement. They don't have any authority to use their judgement as to what should be done. And Senator Morrissey's amendment makes that even more so. It just more eloquently and more forcefully endorses the concept of absolute state control so I can't support that.

**SPEAKER BAACK:** Thank you, Senator Lamb. Senator Schimek, on the Morrissey amendment.

**SENATOR SCHIMEK:** Yes, Mr. President and members of the body, Senator Morrissey, I'd just like to ask you a quick question if I might.

**SENATOR MORRISSEY:** Yes.

**SENATOR SCHIMEK:** I'm just trying to see if I understand this amendment. This asks the commission to prepare a comprehensive plan for...it says for a designated protected stream. Does this mean that each time a stream is so designated that there is a comprehensive plan prepared?

**SENATOR MORRISSEY:** Yes, that is my intent.

**SENATOR SCHIMEK:** Okay, you're not thinking of an overall kind of plan for the whole state that will adapt any protected stream?

**SENATOR MORRISSEY:** I would think that each stream would have very different circumstances and should be looked at separately.

**SENATOR SCHIMEK:** Okay, thank you. I would just like to voice support for this particular amendment and for the Conway amendment and if I understand Senator Conway's amendment correctly. It simply replaces everything that was in 511. Is that correct? Senator Conway, could I ask you.

**SENATOR CONWAY:** Sure.

**SENATOR SCHIMEK:** Your amendment now just simply does away with
