SENATOR CONWAY: It does, but by the same token I did that for white copy purposes and then brought a lot of those concepts Senator Lamb had developed originally back into the white copy, so in terms of we'd already amended in that Natural Resources Commission would be the designator and I put that back in. Some of those things are in so it's simply a rewrite but in order to make that comprehensive and be able to be readable I did it in a white copy form.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay, thank you. I guess I'd also like to respond a little bit to Senator Lamb's comments and, Senator Lamb, I guess I could understand your concern about local control if these streams or rivers were within the boundaries of a county, but I guess that since most streams or rivers run through more than one county, I'm not as concerned about that as you are and with that I guess I would just say I would support both of these amendments. Thank you.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN PRESIDING

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Senator Schimek. Next, Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Kristensen and members of the Legislature, I would like to support both Senator Morrissey and Senator Conway's effort to reconstruct this bill. I guess I have some admiration for Senator Conway for taking on the reconstruction of this bill because I think it has a long ways to go, but the effort is being made and I guess I would like to participate in that. Senator Lamb indicates that this takes all local control away. I guess I have just the opposite problem. I think it still leaves too much in local control and the reason that it does is because there is no hammer in this bill. All the enforcement provisions of the bill are left to the counties and if the counties choose not to enforce whatever use regulations are put into effect by the Natural Resources Commission, I don't see anything in the Conway amendment that would bring about the result if you have recalcitrant counties. So rather than taking away all local control, I think it has not effectively curtail local control on a matter of this nature which I don't consider and I don't think the people of this state consider a matter of local control. It's interesting you...there was a poll done statewide in Nebraska in June of
