The first job I ever had was hawking popcorn at the stadium, really not all that long ago. But it is a fine facility that the city has on line for the next five years. I think to spend at least another \$8 million to continue to improve it, it would be extremely difficult to do that for just the college world series, a 10-day event each summer, but the Royals make it not only economical but they make it feasible as well. With that, I would urge adoption of Senator Wesely's amendment and then Senator Lindsay's and I would give the balance of my time to Senator Chambers if he wants to ask me any more questions.
