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don't see Senator Wehrbein. Senator Schmit. Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I have a couple of questions of Senator Hall, too.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Hall, would you respond, please.

SENATOR HALL: Yes.

SENATOR WARNER: Again, Senator Hall, this is for information so I understand.

SENATOR HALL: Yes.

SENATOR WARNER: To some extent, this is tied to the discussion I had with Senator Lindsay on how long a commitment we are making. There isn't any possi...we have talked on the floor in previous times on what we would prohibit local governments from doing...

SENATOR HALL: Right.

SENATOR WARNER: ...in the way of gambling...

SENATOR HALL: Uh-huh.

SENATOR WARNER: ...in order to preserve it for the state.

SENATOR HALL: Uh-huh.

SENATOR WARNER: And I get the impression, based on the estimates, that if acquisition was done with bonds, conceivably this would be locked in for probably five or six years or some period longer, at least for debt service.

SENATOR HALL: Right, and...

SENATOR WARNER: Are we...under existing law, would we would be locking in some aspect of gambling that otherwise might appropriately be to the state system but we would inadvertently be locked in because of...of...

SENATOR HALL: The payback schedule.

SENATOR WARNER: ...payback schedule, contract commitments?
