Every...any...the least experienced agency director knows how to do that and they have all done it. That's why we've gone from a few hundred million bucks a year when I came here to a billion and a half. When you going to...when are you going to recognize that? Start-up cost, Senator Warner, there's no start-up cost to this. Mr. Hirsch has already done the research without any approval from this Legislature, he did the research, he had the machines out there. No one knew about, they were out there, the research. They like them, I think. They liked them eight years ago when I ran them. They weren't quite as good of machines as I had but they were the same type, looked just like them. The only difference is they now have a little Mickey Mouse kind of a video light underneath them instead of a video screen, so they get around...so we get around the...the law. But the point is this, start-up cost, there's no start-up cost, he just...the revenue just comes in, comes in automatically. The point I want to make is that if you're going to have the money coming in, then you ought to get the biggest percentage you can for the general public. The general public's going to pay most of the cost. And I would suggest that you don't like it necessarily but if you're going to get in the gambling business, you ought to take a little time to learn something about it. Just standing on the floor and speaking about it doesn't really make us an expert on it. You ought to learn something about it. If you don't like to listen to me, go find someone else. There are people here who can tell you something about it. Find some of the people who run the illegal equipment, they can tell you all about it, and they're doing real well at it. The facts are I hope that some day someone decides they're going to stop hiding behind the pillars in this place and come out in the open and do out in the open what we have done inadvertently. I think it's kind of interesting that we want all of this money for enforcement but we haven't done any enforcement. We haven't put out of business those types of competition which are the most serious threat you have to the legal gambling. Why? I don't know why. I don't know why. I would suggest...maybe I'll get in the keno business myself. If I did, I would guarantee there would be enforcement. Roger would follow me around like a...like a hound dog does a bird and that's all right with me. But the facts are that at the present time we...we're not doing much of the enforcement. We're spending a lot of money, we've got a lot of money coming in but you're going to have hundreds
