

SENATOR MOORE: My one final question is this, they are not asking for any additional money now nor will they be in the future, in the near future for this program?

SENATOR WESELY: In fact, the intent is if we better coordinate, we won't have to have any request for additional money. They will use the money they have better. That's the whole purpose.

SENATOR MOORE: Okay, thank you, Senator Wesely.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Moore. Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, Mr. Speaker, and members, I just simply...was this published? I'm not sure what the wording is, Senator Wesely. Did you...I think after your discussion with Senator Moore, I understand what you're doing but what is the amendment?

SENATOR WESELY: Did you look on page 2198?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay, I didn't see it on the board. Okay.

SENATOR WESELY: Well, it's the same amendment but the date was wrong in the amendment on 2198 and so we're asking for the report back by January 1 of '92 so we have it ahead of the session next year.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay, but it's 2198 is what the amendment...okay.

SENATOR WESELY: Yeah. Yeah.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: All right, thank you.

SENATOR WESELY: You bet.

SPEAKER BAACK: Any other discussion on the amendment by Senator Wesely? Seeing none, Senator Wesely, do you wish to close?

SENATOR WESELY: Yes, I appreciate Senator Moore's questions and I hope I clarified for him and Senator Wehrbein and anybody else. What we're trying to do here is indicate that we had a bill that came out of committee without any negative votes that dealt with the question of how we could better coordinate
