

Registry by \$84,000 and carries some things over there. Number six, the Department of Social Services, it simply is another one of these issues where the project has been ongoing and will not be completed by the end of the fiscal year so we are reappropriating the current year balance in money we've already appropriated for the project into the next year to allow it to finish up. Number seven, as we already mentioned, is the lawsuit issue in the Department of Social Services. Number eight, the State Electrical Board requests appropriation of a current balance of finance of relocation of the division from Omaha to Lincoln. That office is now located in Omaha. This money will pay for the moving costs to Lincoln, and since that division is now in the State Office Building in Omaha, the furniture cannot come with it. Also, it will give it some Cash Fund authority to buy some additional equipment on their move to Lincoln. Number nine, in Corrections, it simply eliminates an unnecessary subprogram that's no longer necessary. Number 10, in DAS corrects a fund designation for a previously approved budget issue. It would simply change it from a revolving fund when it should have been a Cash fund. Number 11, the Equal Opportunity Commission, there has been some concern about the committee has, shall we say, trimmed back to a degree some of the positions in the Equal Opportunity Commission because of some behavior patterns over in the Equal Opportunity Commission. This would simply give the EOC some additional public PSL of \$20,938 without being, if indeed, the Equal Opportunity Commission is fully staffed for the entire year, there is not the necessary funds to do that, and if he fully staffed the PSL, PSL, then there may certainly be a deficit coming next year. But this gives enough to the PSL to last through the entire full year if, indeed, he is fully staffed for the entire time. This is something that has not occurred in recent years. Number 12, the Crime Commission, corrects an omission of language to transfer money from the General Fund to the Crimes Against Children Fund. This is the only one on the entire list that has a General Fund impact. It's simply an omission. We forgot to transfer some money over to the Crimes Against Children Fund. Had we known this, it would have automatically been on our mainline budget bill. So this is the only thing that has a General Fund impact of \$25,000 this year and \$85,000 last year. I want you to know that was only an omission why it wasn't in there to begin with. And number 13, the Accountability and Disclosure Commission, increased their Cash Fund authorizations. They had requested some varying reappropriations of balances. After visiting with them, there was some carry-over Cash Fund.
