

You may remember a couple years ago we used to get the reports that talk about how much money all of us and our peers in the political arena spend on elections, they used to give those to us free. Two years ago we gave them the ability to charge a fee for them. The fees are now coming in and if we...the fees are now coming in and this simply would raise it, would actually double the Cash Fund authority from five to 10, and it certainly is anticipated that with the carry-over cash balance and any fee income they expect to incur the next 12 months, this will give them sufficient authority to operate accordingly. And number 14, which I said is not on your handout, I apologize for that, is the PSL in the Foster Care Review Board of \$3,250 which we added in the last amendment. With that explanation, I would ask for the adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Moore. Any other discussion on the amendment offered by Senator Moore? Seeing none, Senator Moore, do you wish to close?

SENATOR MOORE: Would simply ask for adoption of the amendment.
