

I prefer to have nothing in there quite honestly, but if you're going to do it, this is the way to do it. You don't say that the director has to prove this. This simply says when the director, indeed, does close Whitehall that she has to file a report with the Legislative Fiscal Office regarding the following. And a couple of changes, and it says instead of saying that it will result in savings to the State of Nebraska as in Senator Wesely's amendment, it simply will not result in higher costs on an annual basis to the Department of Social Services and the savings that will be realized if the school is closed. It says, it doesn't say the state, it says the department and instead of saying that all local public schools can be placed in public school system, you can read the amendment, you know it just says that she has to report to us the manner in which the local school districts are meeting educational needs of the children served by Whitehall School at the time of its closing. And a couple of times we've referenced that as...I think in Senator Wesely's original amendment, you could argue two years down the road, if a family or a disgruntled employee, quite honestly, wanted to challenge what was done, they could use Senator Wesely's amendment to say that the department cannot close this. This simply says at the time it is closed the children affected at that time, there has to develop a plan on how the others...the existing school districts will deal with those children. It doesn't make it arguably prospective on to the future. Secondly, once again, it says any children at Whitehall at the time of closing, she has to state that they are placed in the State of Nebraska. Once again, this is a concern. If you don't put this in here, I mean, I don't know. It's my hope that they continue to be served in the State of Nebraska, but you could argue a couple years down the road that there would have been a person, had Whitehall been open, they would have been served by Whitehall. For whatever reason, we don't know at this point in time, there was not the service provided in the state; they go out-of-state, once again you allow that person to come back and say, now wait a second, Senator Wesely's amendment said they...any student that would have been at Whitehall has to be served in the State of Nebraska. Though I agree that's a good idea, Senator Wesely, I don't think that's something you want to put in here and that intent language could indeed be construed to do that. Now lastly, as you can see, that it simply says that the Family Resource Center at the Nebraska Center for Children and Youth will not be affected and she has to say that, to report when she closes it. And lastly, that the building currently housing the
