**PRESIDENT MOUL:** We have a request for a call of the house with a roll call vote. All those in favor of a call of the house please vote aye, opposed nay. Please record, Mr. Clerk.

**CLERK:** 17 ayes, 1 nay to go under call, Madam President.

**PRESIDENT MOUL:** The house is under call. Would all unexcused senators please return to the Chamber and record their presence. All unauthorized personnel must leave the floor. Would the senators please be seated and please check in. The house is under call. Would the following senators please check in, Senator Beutler, Senator Lindsay, Senator Chambers, Senator Robak, Senator Robinson, Senator Schimek, Senator Kristensen, please check in. Looking for Senator Robak, Senator Chambers, and Senator Lindsay. Still looking for Senator Robak and Senator Chambers. Senator Lindsay, would you please check in. Senator Schmit, Senator Robak and Senator Chambers are on their way up, would you like to proceed? Okay, we will proceed with the roll call vote. Would the senators please be seated. On the Schmit amendment, Mr. Clerk.

**CLERK:** (Roll call vote taken. See pages 2362-63 of the Legislative Journal.) 15 ayes, 18 nays, Madam President.

**PRESIDENT MOUL:** The amendment fails. I will raise the call. Are there further amendments on the desk?

**CLERK:** Madam President, there are. Senator Bernard-Stevens would move to amend the bill. (See AM1733 on page 2363 of the Legislative Journal.)

**PRESIDENT MOUL:** Senator Bernard-Stevens.

**SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS:** Thank you, Madam President, members of the body. This amendment technically is LB 169, which, in essence, I am going to try to incorporate into 843. The bottom line, for those that are looking at the money, by the way, this is one I am just doing on my own because I feel very much in my own mind that this is something that has to be done, so it wouldn't surprise me if my Appropriations Committee friends said, no, we have to hold the line, Bernard-Stevens, what are you trying to do? But, nonetheless, what this amendment would do is put LB 169 into Social Services and getting it done. It'd best...bottom line, it takes 115,000 the first year, and 136,950
