

because now we are going with the full 25 percent, is to appropriate \$1.8 million from the General Fund to, hopefully, match federal disaster assistance funding. This is an assumption that the Governor will use this entire amount to pay for the nonfederal match. I guess I'd swore right here that I would certainly hope that the Governor, this is myself, at least, hope that the Governor would, if there is a way, if there is some ability for the local communities to pay, they ought to try and find a way to do it. We are funding it the full 25 percent, the Governor certainly has the discretion to do something less than that, if he would so desire. But we are fully funding of the amount from the Governor's emergency fund the 25 percent, the full 25 percent, hoping that FEMA would come up with the rest. Obviously, there are some...the Crawford water system qualifies for a different grant. The original proposal pegged that at \$2.9 million. Now that is down to \$1.6 million. The amount that we have funded, once again we were trying to...we fund, in past situations, the state has funded something less than 50 percent. In recent times, in this situation, the Governor, the Governor requested and the Appropriations Committee has recommended that we fund the full 50 percent of what is possible out there, which is \$579,000, and as with the other situation, that would give the Governor maximum authority if he...if he in his discretion did something less than that if he decided. So if you look at the summary on the bottom there, you can see the Governor's emergency fund, and if you do this, you'd, basically, or would remain...

**SPEAKER BAACK:** One minute.

**SENATOR MOORE:** ...unchanged the past action, and if we do the entire amount here and the Governor chooses to do the full nonfederal match, once again, hopefully, if you do this entire \$1.8 million by July 1, the Governor's emergency fund would be up to a half a million dollars which I think is a desirable level for that to be thinking of any future disaster, Game and Parks, at least the Game and Parks money, the \$374,000, with the hope that maybe FEMA will repay us there, and the Historical Society is 9,230. The total new appropriation being \$2,488,000, excuse me, the correct total there is \$2,288,000 because you have to add the \$100,000 in cash. One thing, one last thing I want to reiterate, this is all assuming FEMA money does come through. If it doesn't, our problem is far greater than \$2.2 million. And, obviously, if that does not occur, we will have to deal with it at that time. So that is the Appropriation
