

that again, on the cigarette tax issue, we've immediately gone to the tried and true here. We didn't consider the Governor's idea of holding it back for prisons, we didn't consider other options like the ones I just outlined to use the money for. There may be better ways to spend the money, I think, than what are being proposed here. In addition, the projects that they use for capital construction, I think, obviously, my concern with Morrill Hall and other projects and not having received the attention I think they deserve. But I understand when a train is running down the track, so I'll just get off the track now and withdraw my amendment.
