And what he was getting at was, should we thus support with state money insecticides to affect other insects and other animals that affect crops? And I guess the question basically gets down to, do we support businesses in this state with state funds? And the answer to that is, obviously, yes, we support all kinds of businesses. And we're talking now about a business that is the largest in the state still, as far as I know. And Senator Coordsen and Senator Withem and myself and some others always had the chinch bug program...I think you were a co-sponsor, Senator Withem, I can't remember, always had the chinch bug program that also was...addressed crop damage and big dollars in this state.
