SENATOR RASMUSSEN: Yes, Madam President, members of the body, I think I've pretty much explained this. What this amendment does is to clarify how the money will be transferred from the Department of Education to the Department of Social Services. Those are federal dollars that they have under an existing grant. And the second part is to clarify how the reimbursement for special education, the state aid reimbursement to the public schools that are involved in the demonstration project, that the amount of Medicaid dollars that are used in this demonstration project will be decreasing the state aid to the special education. I would be glad to answer any questions. Otherwise, I would urge that you support this amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Are there any senators wishing to speak to this amendment? Seeing none, we will now vote on the Rasmussen amendment. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on adoption of Senator Rasmussen's amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The amendment is adopted. Senator Rasmussen, would you like to move?

CLERK: Readvance, Senator.
