The child happened to be, the little boy happened to be the child of some people who had some prestige and they put a lot of pressure on the mother, on the little girl and she wound up taking her little girl out of the school system and enrolling her in a private school. The Lincoln school system has said she could not transfer into Lincoln schools because they have too many or something, the schools are crowded.
