

SENATOR WITHEM: Okay. I thought I'd ask.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Does anyone else wish to speak to this amendment? Seeing none, we will vote on the Baack amendment. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLEPK: 36 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to adopt the amendment.

FRESIDENT MOUL: The motion is approved. Senator Will.

SENATOR WILL: Madam President, I move the readvancement of LB 207 to E & R for further motions.

PRESIDENT MOUL: You've heard the motion to readvance. All those in favor please say aye. Opposed nay. LB 207E is advanced.

CLERK: Madam President, Senator Chambers would move to return the bill. (Chambers amendment appears on page 2418 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President and members of the Legislature, the amendment that I have up there would strike what we've been discussing as the Lincoln language. If you turn to pages 12 and 13 of the bill, starting on page 12, lines 23-25, then go to page 13, lines 1-10 you'll strike all of what is labeled in the bill as subsection (2). That language creates, in effect, the same type of situation that existed in Omaha which we just removed from the bill with our, I think you'd call it the penultimate vote, next to the last. I have to get that cleared with Senator Landis. The reason I have to get it cleared with Senator Landis, as some of you all may not know this, there was a big picture in the World-Herald this morning of Senator Landis talking to an individual and the World-Herald said that the CBS crew was here filming the Legislature. No, they were filming a legislator, the most humble, modest one on the floor. Me. Didn't even mention me. So since Senator Landis eclipsed me in so many...eclipses me in so many ways, I have to make sure that when I use one of those kind of high-priced words that it's the correct one. That's why I looked to him for approval. But this amendment would take out that language from the bill which creates the following
