And we're really talking about a very, very narrow situation and so I think it's...I think we're simply trying to become, as state senators, become parents for people and I think we should let them make that decision if they want their children with them at occasional bingo. So I...I strongly oppose returning this to Select File.

These kind of things in the long run may not be as innocuous as we think. I think I can smell what's going to happen in here. I can sense, at least, sense may be a better word, but at least I offered it and I would just urge you to vote to return to Select File.
