PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Hefner. Is there anyone who wishes to discuss the Warner amendment? Seeing none, do you have closing, Senator Warner. Closing is waived. We will now vote on the Warner amendment. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 18 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on adoption of Senator Warner's amendment to the committee amendments.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The amendment is adopted. Further amendments.

CLERK: Senator Warner would move to amend, Madam President. Senator, I have your AM1989 in front of me.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Which one was this?

SENATOR WARNER: Madam President, members of the Legislature, this is an amendment to the committee amendment which does the things which were discussed on the floor that was not included in the committee amendments as originally drafted. You may recall there was some discussion on the floor relative to the budget bills. As I recall, it was talked about when we were talking about the increase in the Governor's emergency fund which there was indicated there would be some General Fund reduction in the LB 627 in the amount of about \$900,000 for the year. Currently, the collection for...the cost of collection for motor fuel revenue, as it has always been, has been paid for out of General Fund appropriations. This will authorize the transfer from the Highway Trust Fund for the collection. It establishes a cash fund for the Motor Fuels Division. There is the E clause added so that it can take effect.
