CLERK: Madam President, the first item I have on 829 are E & R amendments.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Will.

SENATOR WILL: Madam President, I would depart from my normal introduction of the E & R amendment just to inform the body that, for their information, the E & R amendment becomes the white copy of the bill. This is AM5164, and so if you're desiring to draft amendments to 829, the E & R amendment is what you should look at. With that, I would move the adoption of the E & R amendment to LB 829.

PRESIDENT MOUL: You've heard the motion to adopt the E & R amendments. All those in favor please say aye. Opposed nay. Amendments are adopted.

CLERK: Madam President, the first amendment I have to the bill is by Senator Elmer.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Elmer is excused. Is there anyone here who is prepared to handle that for him? Okay, proceed with the next amendment.

CLERK: Madam President, the next amendment I have is by Senator Dierks. Senator, I have your AM1798 in front of me. It's my understanding you want to withdraw that and substitute 2037, Senator, is that correct?

SENATOR DIERKS: That's right, please.

PRESIDENT MOUL: If there are no objections to the substitute, it will be so ordered. Senator Dierks. (Dierks amendment appears on pages 2432-37 of the Legislative Journal.)
