PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Hall. We will now vote on the Hall amendment. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: Madam President, I would ask for a call of the house and accept call in votes.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Motion for a call of the house. Senator Lindsay.

SENATOR LINDSAY: I'd ask for a roll call.

PRESIDENT MOUL: All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay on the call of the house. Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 34 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The house is under call. Would all senators please be seated and record their presence. All unexcused senators please return to the Chambers. Senator Schrock, Senator Labedz, Senator Morrissey. Okay, we will proceed with a roll call vote.

CLERK: (Read roll call vote. See page 2447 of the Legislative Journal.) 25 ayes, 20 nays, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The amendment to the amendment is adopted. I will raise the call. Are there further amendments on it? Items for the record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Madam President, a couple of items. Your Committee on Enrollment and Review reports LB 843 as correctly engrossed and that is signed by Senator Will as Chair of E & R. (See page 2447 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: I did raise the call.

CLERK: I believe we are back to the Hall amendment as amended. Madam President, I do have an amendment from...Senator Lindsay would move to amend the Hall amendment. Senator, I understand you want to amend AM2033 which was just adopted. Is that correct? (Lindsay amendment appears on page 2449 of the
