Now we're going to make...

PRESIDENT MOUL: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...a major overhaul in the taxing system of the state, making a foray into uncharted territory on Select File. I don't think there are many people who read the one paragraph of Senator Hall's amendment and I would defy Senator Hall or anybody else to define with precision what those terms mean. They are too vague, and were I somebody required to pay the tax, I wouldn't pay it. I'd say I don't even know what it's talking about. Then when we went to court the court would say, I, who am subject to the law, should not be required to guess at the meaning of the Legislature, and since the record of this debate indicates that those who support the amendment don't know what the words mean, then the person made subject to the law cannot be required to figure out and try to divine what the Legislature itself did not understand. I was opposed to that amendment. I will...

PRESIDENT MOUL: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...definitely not support this bill, but I may give a vote to Senator Lindsay except that I won't because I'm against all taxes on services.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Madam President. Senator Chambers is right. This amendment is crazy, and when you think about it and you look at it, it's really we're talking about substantive tax policy at eight thirty-one on a Select File bill that, you know, with a language that is all vague. Heard that before? Not too long ago, about an hour, a little more than that. But what is all services? Terms of the handwritten amendment that is on the desk. All services, well, I don't know what that means. I don't know how clear that is. I don't know what a definition of a service is. Is that prostitution? Is that a service? What are we taxing here? All services. Under the definition of
