

will do it, somewhat narrower but not significantly different as far as policy.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Warner. Senator Pirsch.

SENATOR PIRSCH: I echo Senator Warner's fears and think he is right. This will not be the first one that we will hear from but maybe it's appropriate and maybe it's appropriate because citizens do have the opportunity and will with those things that we have done to allow them to challenge what we do on this floor here. And maybe that's right and maybe that's appropriate, even though we felt...we feel very strongly about some things. It is not going to be the last and I think that we should evaluate our actions on this floor with that in mind. And I also reluctantly support LR 190.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Pirsch. Does anyone else wish to speak to this resolution? Seeing none, do you have closing, Senator Moore?

SENATOR MOORE: Oh, yes, I mean, I stated in the...obviously, not everyone in this body certainly is wild about paying this bill but it's one of those things, as with any lawsuit, when you lose, even though you didn't bring it upon yourself, when you lose the court orders you to pay the other side's fee, it's simply something you have to do. Now, actually, if you didn't do this, the court would have the ultimate power to draw funds on the state anyway and so, I mean, you can certainly make a protest vote if you choose to but, obviously, we really have no alternative. And, with that, I would urge the body to pass LR 190.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Moore. We will now vote on the motion to adopt LR 190. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 25 ayes, 1 nay on the adoption of the resolution, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: LR 190 is adopted. LR 191.
