SPEAKER BAACK: We have a request for the house to go under call. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 11 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: The house is under call. All members please report to the chamber and record your presence. Call-in votes have been authorized. The house is under call.

CLERK: Senator Conway voting yes. Senator Dierks voting yes. Senator Will voting yes. Senator Schellpeper voting yes.

SPEAKER BAACK: The house is under call.

CLERK: Senator Schrock voting yes. Senator Schimek voting yes.

SPEAKER BAACK: Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, to suspend the germaneness rule.

SPEAKER BAACK: The germaneness rule is suspended. We will now go to consideration of the amendment. Senator Kristensen. Call is raised.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members. The amendment, again, basically is that of a clean-up so we can get into the transition from the state college system to the university system. This is, as I understand it, cigarette tax money that's accumulated since 1983 under LB 410 that occurred at that time. This would just allow the authorization of that money, which the State College Board has already earmarked. They have given their blessing and they authorized the purchase of this in January of this year. So the State College Board understood that before Kearney gets out of the system they need to complete this transaction and get the property over onto the University of Nebraska at Kearney's campus. To do so, it takes our ratification or authorization to do that as well and that is the basic purpose of the amendment. This is not new money. This is not raising taxes. This is not that sort of thing. This is an authorization of money that's already existing that was there for the specific projects that they designated back in
