

provide that term protection that carries that person out until the balance of their term, which I believe is up in 1994. So this would amend it to provide that term protection, so I offer that as an amendment to the committee amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Conway. Is there anyone who wishes to address this amendment? Seeing none, we will vote on the Conway amendment. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 22 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on adoption of Senator Conway's amendment to the committee amendments.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Amendment is adopted. Senator Conway, would you like to address the committee amendments?

SENATOR CONWAY: Thank you, Madam President. The easiest way to actually follow the committee amendment as it's written follows the map that you'll see for Public Service Commission, which is the first map listed in the booklet or the packet that you've got. The primary consideration on the Public Service Commission is, again, the population degradation that we've experienced in some of the rural communities and so, in line with readjusting the boundaries in order to accommodate that, the most significant change you will see is District 5, where we have added Phelps, Kearney, Harlan and Franklin County to District 5 in order to give it the balance of its population, and also then to District 4 we had to move Platte and Colfax into District 4 from District 3. For the most part, there are minor changes around the Douglas-Sarpy area to include the changes that are necessary there, but the most salient in terms of major county movement, as you can see, will be the changes out in the west and adding Platte and Colfax County to the 4th Public Service District. So, basically, it's one of those visuals. By the way, the large blown up maps, if you want more detail, we've placed over in the Senators' Lounge and so anyone who can't quite visualize specifically from the maps that are provided and the statistics provided can go into the Senators' Lounge and identify any one of these. They're all listed there as well. The population for the Public Service Commission you can see came out very, very close. We literally are down to the largest negative or positive for statewide operations of 703 in the positive and 727 on the low end, so we're really talking about a maximum range of only .2 percent, .2 percent on either side of that tolerance level, so we're very, very close to the projected
